Introduction. Since 1913, when Parker Browne Francis II first launched the Oxygen Gas Company in Kansas City, Missouri, the Francis family has continued to be an inspirational and influential force in the Kansas City metropolitan area. In 1951, as the company grew and developed into a major national manufacturer and supplier of industrial and medical gases, Parker B. Francis II established a foundation bearing his name to help promote education and research in the fields of anesthesiology and related pulmonary sciences. Parker B. Francis III also established a foundation to fund his interests in education, and arts and culture. Since the two foundations merged in 1989 to become the Francis Family Foundation, the pattern of grantmaking made today still reflects the interests of the founding donors. Today, thanks to the vision of Parker B. Francis and his son John B. Francis, the Francis Family Foundation celebrates 59 years of philanthropy, including the funding of the Parker B. Francis Pulmonary Fellowship Program and support of educational and arts programs geographically located within the greater Kansas City metropolitan area. It is in the context of this history that the 2010 Annual Report honors the accomplishments of more than 260 grants representing a social investment of more than \$5.6 million. While John B. Francis and his wife Mary Harris Francis are both deceased, stewardship of the Foundation was passed to their children – Ann F. Barhoum, David V. Francis, J. Scott Francis and Susan Neves – and four non-family Board members – Gregory Glore, Mary Lou Jaramillo, Charles Schellhorn and Katie Wendel. Susan Neves has since retired from the Board. The Foundation is also served by two community advisors: David Oliver and Susan Stanton. In 2008, the Foundation Board of Directors created an updated Strategic Plan, which identified three major funding priorities: Pulmonary Research, Lifelong Learning and Arts & Culture.

Parker B. Francis Pulmonary Fellowship Program. In 1975, John Byers Francis created the Pulmonary Fellowship program in honor of his father, Parker B. Francis II. Since then, the Foundation has contributed more than \$52 million in support of more than 780 Fellows. In 2010, Fellowship grants totaled \$2 million in support of 40 Fellows. Lifelong Learning. In 2010, the Foundation invested more than \$1.4 million in Lifelong Learning grants under the strategic plan. Four grants supported early childhood development efforts in the metro area with an emphasis on professional development for providers and support for advocacy efforts. Examples include support for the Francis Resource Center and the Francis Institute for Child and Youth Development (professional development); and, Kansas Action for Children (advocacy) – a critical player in the movement to expand government support for early education initiatives.

Parents are the key to a child's early development. To strengthen their capacity, the Foundation approved funding for six parent initiative grants, which will help increase school readiness. These programs focus primarily on literacy development and verbal communication in children from birth to age five. Several also take a more comprehensive view of early childhood development with literacy and communication as part of several core training components. The Foundation expects these efforts to lay the groundwork for children's success in school, an important benchmark for the community.

2 Arts & Culture. As the year 2010 came to an end, the Foundation Board of Directors approved more than \$900,000 through 80 grants to support arts and culture organizations and programs in the Kansas City metropolitan area. Total 2010 investments in arts and culture, including multi-year commitments approved in prior years, crossed the \$1M mark.

Grant Highlights. The Foundation continues to support the many arts and culture institutions that “anchor” a strong and vibrant quality of life in Kansas City including innovative programs of the Charlotte Street Foundation, American Jazz Museum and Mattie Rhodes Art Center. At the same time, through our small arts program, the Foundation seeds both new and emerging organizations, and expands access for children and underserved populations throughout the community. The Foundation also invests in strategies that strengthen the role of arts in the K-12 education process. Ongoing efforts include the expansion of Kansas City Young Audiences’ Arts Partners programming and advocacy efforts of the Missouri Alliance for Arts Education. Strengthening professional development strategies for teachers and teaching artists, as well as building a stronger base of public support for arts and education generally are the early targets of this investment.

Our Vision. The Francis Family Foundation envisions current and future generations of well-rounded individuals who are creative, lifelong learners, striving to achieve their fullest potential within their communities.

Pulmonary Research

The Foundation created the Parker B. Francis Fellowship Program, a *national postdoctoral study in pulmonary research* in 1975. The Foundation remains its sole benefactor today. The program supports the development of outstanding investigators planning careers in pulmonary research and awards fellowships in fields related to lung biology and pulmonary disease. 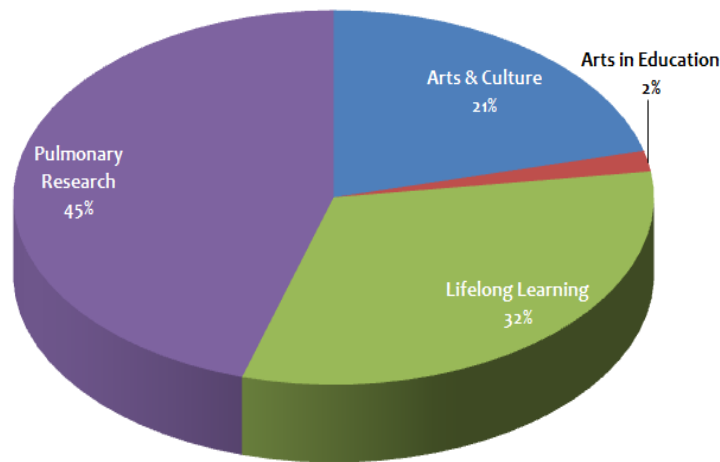
Discretionary Grants
